BACKGROUND:

The Yayasan IPNLF Indonesia (YII) works to develop, support and promote socially and environmentally responsible pole-and-line, handline and troll (collectively one-by-one) tuna fisheries in Indonesia. YII's ambition is to contribute to thriving coastal fisheries, including the people, communities, businesses and seas connected with them. As a hub for sustainably-minded organisations, we use the influence of the market to forge change through practical fishery projects and stakeholder cooperation. Allied with our Members, YII demonstrates the value of one-by-one caught tuna to consumers, policymakers and throughout the supply chain. We work across science, policy and the seafood sector, using an evidence-based, solutions-focused approach with guidance from our Scientific & Technical Advisory Committee, Market Advisory Group and Board of Trustees

JOB SUMMARY:

Assist the implementation of YAYASAN IPNLF INDONESIA (YII) Program to develop, support and promote socially and environmentally responsible pole-and-line, handline and troll (collectively one-by-one) tuna fisheries, through specific programmes in the target area. The Fisheries Specialist (FS) will report to the Southeast Asia Director. Depending on the area of intervention, the YII programmes requiring FS support will include activities, such as:

1. Coordination and outreach with fishery partners from local government, private sector and NGOs.
2. Implementation of Electronic Monitoring (EM) programme.
3. Implementation of electronic Catch Documentation and Traceability (eCDT) programme together with private sector partners.
4. Implementation of the fisheries improvement programme covering science, policy and socio-economic aspects of one-by-one fisheries and their supply chains.
5. Implementation of ecolabels programmes, such as Fair-Trade and the Marine Stewardship Council (MSC).
6. Implementation of the social and economic welfare improvement programme for one-by-one fishers in the target areas.
7. Implementation of the food safety improvement programme that improves fish quality and fish value, reduces post-harvest losses and achieves/maintains compliance with international standards.
8. Development and implementation of clean energy initiatives within the one-by-one supply chain, as part of YII climate change adaptation programme.

TASKS:

The Fisheries Specialist (FS) will work under supervision from the Southeast Asia Director and coordinate with other Senior Staff to:

- Coordinate with fishery stakeholders and partners, such as fishers; private sector; NGOs and government to implement Yayasan IPNLF Indonesia (YII) objectives and fishery projects.
- Support data analysis and data management for EM and eCDT projects.
- Provide support to the YII team for local engagement and outreach to stakeholders in the target locations.
- When needed, the Fisheries Specialist will organise and facilitate meetings, training, and workshops (formal and informal) with fishers, the private sector, government, and NGOs to support the YII's programme implementation.
- Collaborate with industry associations, primarily to strengthen and broaden the partnership between YII and AP2HI.
- Collaborate with the Programme Manager to conduct monitoring and evaluation for currently implemented projects and report on results to the SE Asia Director and other team members;
- Support the development and distribution of communication materials to tell the story of 1x1 tuna fisheries.
- Represent YII at national forums and meetings, acting as a representative for our Mission and aligned work.
- Support the implementation of data collection (fisheries and socio-economic data) by IPNLF and implementing partners to ensure consistent monitoring and implementation of data reliant interventions.
- Support the implementation of ecolabel initiatives (such as MSC and Fair Trade) and maintain online FIP profiles among IPNLF Members and other partners working with one-by-one tuna fisheries in Indonesia.
- Support the development and implementation of clean energy interventions among one-by-one tuna fisheries in target locations.
- Support the food safety improvement programme and document lessons learnt to formulate and document best practices.
- Support any other relevant activities as required

REQUIRED SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE

Education:

- University Degree (S1), preferably in fisheries or resource management or other related degree.

Experience:

- At least 4 years of relevant experience working on or directly involved in local fisheries, fisheries management and/or the tuna sector; particular knowledge and previous experiences in working with local governments, seafood companies and university partners within the target area will be considered an asset;

Language Requirements:

- Fluency in Bahasa Indonesia and familiarity with local language of people in the target areas;
- Proficient in reading, speaking and writing in English with good presentation skills.
